Application: Links to all online application forms can be found on our website under the tab "Volunteer Application." Select New York City, NY as the Region in the dropdown menu. If the form asks for an agency, enter: Safe Families for Children NYC.

- Profile picture:** Please email a picture that we can upload to our database.
- Married Applicants:** Family Friend and Family Coach applications are completed as individuals because these volunteers are assigned individually. If both members of a married couple want to volunteer, then fill out separate applications (however references can overlap). Hosts who are a married couple can fill out one host application together.

Training: Training can be completed online under the "**Community Hub**" link on our website: <https://safe-families.org/community-hub>.

- Create a new account** to view the training.
- Enrollment Key:** Email a staff member to get the enrollment key to view the training.
- Watch "Family Friend Mentoring (without hosting)"** (2 ½ hours total).
- Notify us at nyc@safefamilies.net once you have completed an online training.
- Additional and supplemental trainings are available on the Community Hub.

Letters of Recommendation: It is our policy to vet Safe Families for Children volunteers whose lives reflect stable personal values and morals.

- Volunteers need to choose three people (cannot be a family member) who can attest to this aspect of their lives, one of which must be from pastoral leadership.
- Please be sure to include the names and emails of three references when you complete your application. We will send the reference form directly to your references.

Interview: Volunteers must engage with a SFFC staff member for a 15 minute phone interview to ensure their safety and eligibility to volunteer. The safety of the children and parents we serve is our highest priority. An interview can be scheduled as soon as an application is received. We will send you the questions that will be covered.

Background checks: There are 3 background checks needed for volunteers to work with children: NY State fingerprinting, FBI fingerprinting, and NY State Child Abuse Registry. Volunteers request to have these background checks as individuals desiring to volunteer with children. Instructions to conduct these background checks are on our webpage "**Forms**" tab.

Home screening: Family Friends who desire to babysit children in their own home are required to have a home safety checklist, which can be completed by a Family Coach or staff member. When hosting becomes available, we will resume home screenings. The 2-hour home screening includes an interview to expand on the questions asked in the application, a tour of the home, and a home safety checklist.
